On board Her Majesty's Ship *Hercules*, in Carleton Place, Barbados, on the 13th November, on the eve of departure for Halifax, Major Robert Noble Crose, of the 30th Regiment, in which Corps he had served nearly 32 years, highly esteemed by his brother officers, and respectfully beloved by the soldiers of that distinguished Regiment, amongst whom he shared in the glories of their Peninsular campaign, and was wounded at Salamanca. The deceased was interred in the burying ground of St. Paul's Chapel, with the usual military honours due to his rank in the army, attended by the officers of the Garrison, and several highly respectable gentlemen of the Island. He was a gallant soldier and an honest man. During the mourning ceremony, the *Hercules* sailed with the 3th on board, for Halifax. — *Barbadian.*
At Barbados, on the 9th January, after an illness of nearly three weeks, Captain Polkinghorne, of Her Majesty's Ship *Cyclops*. We have seldom had to record the death of a more meritorious officer or deserving man. Fond of his profession, and zealous and active in the discharge of his public duties, his life was almost wholly passed upon the ocean. He ranked high in the estimation of his superiors in the Navy, and was warmly esteemed by all who had the pleasure of his acquaintance.
