CENTENARY OF METHODISM.

The Centenary meeting was held at the Wesleyan meeting house in this town, on Tuesday the 20th instant, which was numerously attended.—The Rev. Mr. ALDER, one of the Secretaries of the Conference in London, presided upon the occasion; and there were present the Rev. Messrs. Bennett, Miller, Temple, Williams, Busby and Wood, from Nova Scotia and different parts of this Province, and Messrs. Shepherd and Leggett of this circuit.

Mr. Alder addressed the meeting at much length, by giving the audience a brief analysis of the history of Methodism from its commencement, until the present period, and the designs and objects of the Centenary Meeting. The sum already contributed towards this fund in England had amounted to upwards of Two Hundred and Twenty Thousand Pounds, sterling.

Amongst the various objects which the Committee have in view in the appropriation of the Centenary fund, the following are the most prominent, viz:—

£25,000 will be appropriated for the establishment of a theological institution in London. £15,000 for a minor institution in the Province—probably in Lancashire.—£16,000 for the purchase of Missionary premises, which have been obtained on very reasonable terms in London, about five minutes walk from the Bank of England, and in a situation easy of access to strangers. A sum of money is to be set apart to assist in discharging Chapel debts, and the sum of £10,000 for the commencement of a fund from whence worn-out Missionaries, and the widows of deceased Missionaries, their children and orphans, might obtain support and the means of education.

The sum of £2600 had also been appropriated to fit out a ship, and keep her running between New South Wales and the Islands in the Southern Pacific.

Notwithstanding the terrible calamity with which the City of St. John had lately been visited, the sum obtained there was £1450.—In addition to the sum which had of late been so liberally subscribed, without being aware that it was intended to make the present appeal, the sum of nearly £500 were obtained during the evening—which added to the sum of £1,150 formerly subscribed towards enlarging the Chapel—the purchase of a lot of ground, and paying off certain heavy incumbrances, amounts to the sum of £1,650 raised in this small community, within the last two months of the Centenary year.

STAGE TO FREDERICTON.

The Commissioners appointed by the Legislature, have made arrangements with Mr. James M. Kelly, for running a Stage, between the above mentioned places. In future the Stage will leave Miramichi every Monday morning, calling at Rennie's Ferry, opposite Chatham, at 4 before 7 A. M. for Passengers and Luggage; pass through Douglastown, calling at Chalmers' Tavern at 7 o'clock, A. M. for Passengers and Luggage, and leave Hamill's Hotel, Newcastle, precisely at eight o'clock, A. M., arrive in Fredericton not later than 4 o'clock, P. M., on Tuesday, and put up at M'Leod's. Will leave Fredericton, starting from the same place, every Thursday morning, not later than eight o'clock, and arrive in Miramichi on Friday, not later than four o'clock, P. M. Passengers and Luggage for Chatham and Douglastown will be sent down to their respective places immediately after the arrival of the Stage at Hamill's Hotel.—Gleaner.
