

not been for the wind subsiding, the fire must have extended to Mam Charley's. Our city has the appearance of an old building, as nothing is standing but chimneys.

[Another account states that the Episcopal Church, as well as the Catholic, was burnt.—The fire is said to have been the work of incendiaries. The burnt district is said to be a third of a mile square.]

#### YET ANOTHER DESTRUCTIVE FIRE IN MOBILE.

We recorded this morning the destruction of 500 or 600 houses in Mobile on the night of the 7th inst. They were mostly small, and the damage is estimated in the Mobile papers at only \$120,000. In prosperous times, we are told, the destruction of these houses would hardly have been deemed a calamity to the city; but at present, the case is otherwise.

Letters of the 9th inst. announce the occurrence of a fire, which comparatively few buildings, caused a much greater loss of property than the other; the buildings burnt being among the best in the city. A gentleman well acquainted in Mobile, estimates the loss by this fire at \$750,000. The Bank building alone cost about \$200,000. The two Hotels were also expensive and valuable buildings.—N. Y. Journal of Commerce.

#### General Post Office.

HALIFAX, 28th Sept. 1839.

THE following Section of the Act of the Imperial Parliament, 1st Victoria, cap. 36, is published for the information of the Ferryman in the Provinces of Nova Scotia and New Brunswick:

"SECTION X. And be it enacted, That no Deputy, Officer, or Agent of the Postmaster General, travelling with a Mail, shall pay for passing or repassing a Ferry within any of Her Majesty's Colonies or Dominions in North America, but the Ferryman at every such Ferry shall forthwith on demand convey over every such Deputy, Officer or Agent, without any payment for the same, on pain of forfeiting for every offence Five Pounds, to be recovered in any Court of Record within any of the Provinces or Colonies in North America, by Bill, Plaint or Information, wherein no Essoign, Protection or Wager of Law shall be allowed, one moiety thereof to Her Majesty, towards the support of the Government of the said Province, and the contingent charges thereof, and the other moiety to the Postmaster General, who shall sue and prosecute for the same, together with full costs of suit."
