For which purpose, I have authorized and do hereby authorize the said Warden to 20. Speaker & Members of Asemploy and take with him on his visits of examination such sufficient force or posse of assistants as may enable him to carry into effect the object and intention of this Proclamation.

And I do hereby call upon and direct as well all Peace Officers as all other liege subjects of Her Majesty within the Province, to be aiding and assisting in all things within their power, to enable the said Warden to discharge his duty in the premises.
