Downing Street, 14th May, 1840.

SIR,—I have the honor to lay before the Queen the Address from the Legislative Council and House of Assembly of New Brunswick, which accompanied your Dispatch No. 19 of the 31st March.

Her Majesty has commanded me to instruct you to signify to the two Houses of the local Legislature, in answer, the high gratification with which she has received the assurance of the interest they take in Her Union in Marriage with H. R. H. Prince Albert of Saxe-Coburg and Gotha, and of their conviction that an event so conducive to the Queen's domestic happiness, will also tend to promote the welfare of H. M. Provincial Subjects.

To contribute to the prosperity of so important a branch of the British Empire as the Province of New Brunswick, will always be regarded by the Queen as at once amongst the highest of the duties to the discharge of which she has been called, and amongst the greatest felicities of Her Reign.

INSPECTION OF THE 36TH REGIMENT.
