This being the day appointed for the Terminal Examination, the Students keeping Lent Term were examined together in their critical and historical knowledge of the Greek Testament, the fundamental principles of Moral Philosophy, and the elements of Chemistry.

They were also examined separately in some of the Classical authors in whom their studies had been so pursued: the first Class having read Pindar, Theocritus and Sophocles; the second, Herodotus, Sophocles and Juvenal; the third, Xenophon, Livy and Horace. The examiners were highly gratified with the prompt and correct answers given, in almost every instance, to the very numerous questions proposed, and with the accuracy with which Greek and Latin writers of the first rank were translated. It was equally gratifying to the Vice President to be able to report that, with scarcely any exception, the conduct of the Students during the Term had been attentive, moral and decorous.

The Students, who intend to keep Easter Term, are required to attend at the College Chapel on Wednesday, April 22nd, when Divine Service will begin at eleven o'clock; nor can any who shall then be absent, without special permission under my hand for sufficient reasons assigned, or shall omit to present to me the Registrar's receipts, be allowed to reckon the Term.
