A PROCLAMATION.

HER Majesty having been pleased, by Her Royal Commission this day published, to constitute and appoint me to be Lieutenant Governor of this Province of New Brunswick, the said Commission of the Government of which I have this day assumed, I do therefore publish this Proclamation, of which all persons concerned are required to take due notice and govern themselves accordingly.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Fredericton, this twenty seventh day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty one, and in the fourth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

The Supervisors of the Great Roads and Commissioners of Bye Roads and Bridges, are hereby directed to transmit to this Office, on or before the tenth day of October next regular Accounts, with Vouchers of their several disbursements from the Appropriations of the current year, upon the Roads and Bridges entrusted to their management. The attention of the Commissioners of Bye Roads is also particularly called to the Sixth Section of the Act of the last Session "to provide for opening and repairing Roads and erecting Bridges"; and such of them as are entrusted with the expenditure of money to the amount of £250, are further required forthwith to transmit to this Office proper Bonds, with two competent Sureties, in double the amount of the sum to be expended, conditioned for the faithful performance of their duty.

MILITIA GENERAL ORDER.

With reference to the Militia General Order of the 16th November, 1840, (requiring Officers Commanding Battalions to furnish the Quarter Master General of the Militia Forces, with correct returns of the number, state and condition of the Arms and Accoutrements in possession of their respective Corps,) it has been found that many cases of omission have occurred.

Commanding Officers of Corps therefore who have failed to comply with the Order above alluded to, are required forthwith to send in their Returns, in order that the Quarter Master General may be enabled to prepare a General Return of all Arms and Accoutrements belonging to the Militia, for the information of the Lieutenant Governor, preparatory to the approaching Inspection.

Commanding Officers will also report whether they have caused to be erected any and what places of safe deposit, (or Arm House) for the reception and security of the Arms.
