HOUSE OF LORDS, 2d February. On Motion of the Earl of Shaftesbury, the Earl of Cardigan was taken into enstody by the Usher of the Black Rod. His Lordship was admitted to bail, on furnishing two surefies in £5,000 each, and himself in £10,000 to appear when ordered.

The Moniteur of Sunday evening publishes the following :- We have received this evening by means of the Anstrian embassy, intelligence of importance from the East. On the 12th January one of the Officers of the Sultan left Establishment has been carried on by its pre Constantinople for Alexandria, the bearer of a firman, by which His Highness officially accords to Mehemet Ali the hereditary possession of Egypt. On the 14th of the same mouth Mehemet Ali restored the Turkish fleet. 
