SIR,—We have the honor to report, for the information of Lord John Russell, and with a view to its being communicated to the proper Authorities in the North American Provinces, that we have instructed our Naval Agents to transmit through the Post, by the earliest Mail Steamers leaving this Country after every Passenger Vessel has cleared for sea at their respective Ports, a Duplicate List of her Passengers, addressed to the Immigration Agent of the Colony to which the Ship is bound.

We have adopted this measure under a belief that it would be equally advantageous to the Emigrants and to the Colonists.
