

natural Cotangents (to the radius 20) of the angles of elevation at A, B, C, respectively. From A lay off m to D, and make the angle A D G equal to the angle C, again lay off P from A to E, and draw E F parallel to D G.

Also, with the distance of n as a radius and centre D describe an arc, and with the distance A F and centre G describe an arc to cut the former, in H draw D. H. Now make the angle A B T equal to A H D and produce the line until it meets A H produced, which gives the base of the Tower at T.

In the triangle A E F all the angles are given, and side A E to find A F by case 1st plain Trigonometry.

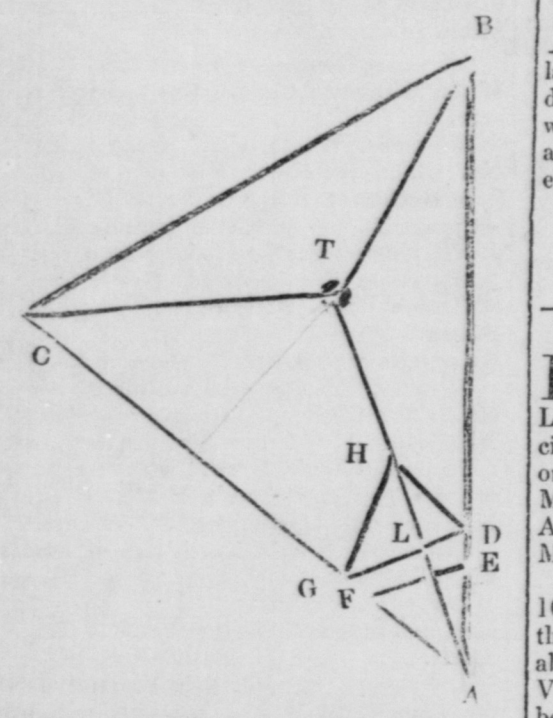
In the triangle A D G, all the angles are given, and side A D to find D G, case 1st plain Trigonometry.

In the triangle D G H, all the sides are given to find the angle G D H by case 3d plain Trigonometry.

Now A D G + G D H = A D H.

Then in the triangle A H D the two sides A D and D H and the contained angle A D H are given to find A H D which is = A B T by construction. Then in the triangle A T B, the angle A B T, A T B (which is equal to the angle A D H) and A B are given to find B T (case 1st plain Trigonometry) the distance from station B to the base of the Tower, which multiplied by the natural tangent of the angle elevation at B gives the Tower's height.
