IN THE SURROGATE COURT FOR THE COUNTY OF YORK.

In the matter of the Estate of Simon H. Estey, deceased, Intestate.

UPON reading the Petition of Nelson A. Cliff (the Sole Administrator of the Estate of the said Simon H. Estey, who died Intestate,) duly attested to and this day presented, whereby, and by the Accounts and Inventory thereto annexed, it appears that the whole personal Estate of the said Simon H.
