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

HEREAS the GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF this Province stands prorogued to Tuesday the fifteenth day of June next, I have thought fit further to prorogue the said GENE-RAL ASSEMBLY, and the same is hereby prorogued to the third Tuesday in September next.

Whereas the Governor of Her Hajesty's Province of New Brunswick, with the Council and Assembly of the said Province, did in the months of March and September, 1839, and March, 1840, pass three Acts, which have been transmitted, entitled as follows, viz :---

No. 1237. An Act for the improvement of the practice in the Court of Chancery.

No. 1253. An Act to authorize the widening and enlarging of certain Streets in the City of Saint John, and of laying out other Streets therein.

No. 1340. An Act to alter and amend an Act, entitled "An Act to authorize the widening and enlarging of certain Streets in the City of Saint John, and of laying out other Streets therein."

And whereas the said Acts have been referred to the Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, appointed for the consideration of all matters relating to Trade and Foreign Plantations, and the said Committee have reported as their opinion to Her Majesty, that the said Acts should be left to their operation; Her Majesty was thereupon this day pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve the said report: Whereof the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief for the time being of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.
