An Act to establish a Provincial House of Correction.

Passed 26th March 1841. Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly, That Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace for the said City and County of Saint John shall, and they are hereby required, as soon as conveniently may be after the time appointed for this Act to go into operation, to cause to be prepared a full and correct statement of the accounts relating to the erection and establishment of the said House of Correction, exhibiting the various sums taken on Loan, according to the provisions of the said recited Acts or any of them, the times when and the persons from whom the said amounts were borrowed, the notes or certificates given for the same and the numbers thereof, the mode in which the said sums have been expended, the whole cost of the building, and, generally, a complete statement of all the costs and charges incidental to the erection and establishment of the said House of Correction ; which said statement shall be verified by the oath of the Committee who had the management of the erection of the said building or by the oath of them, made before any Justice of the Peace for the said City and County.
