## A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS a Proclamation, bearing date the twenty ninth day of July last, was issued, commanding all Persons who have illegally occupied any Lands reserved by the Crown for the benefit of the Indians, forthwith to quit the same, and to abstain from cutting or removing Timber therefrom; And whereas it is expedient furthermore effectually to prevent the infraction of the prohibition; I do therefore hereby require and strictly command all Persons whatsoever to abstain from cutting or removing any Timber from the said reserved Lands without Licence, or from otherwise trespassing thereon upon any pretence whatsoever: And I do further require and command all seizing Officers to be vigilant in detecting any trespasses that may be committed on any of the said reserved Lands, and promptly to seize all Timber that may be found to have been cut thereon, without Licence for that purpose first obtained.

## A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS a Proclamation, bearing date the twenty sixth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty seven, was issued by the Lieutenant Governor, forbidding all persons from occupying any part of the Wild Lands within this Province, comprehending the Territory in dispute between Great Britain and the United States of America, known under the denomination of the *Disputed Territory*, of trespassing thereon by cutting Timber or otherwise: And whereas by another Proclamation, bearing date the twenty second day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty nine, this prohibition was repeated, and the Warden of the said Territory was duly appointed and authorized to arrest, seize, take and destroy all Timber which might be cut in violation thereof: And whereas it is deemed necessary that the aforesaid prohibition should continue to be strictly enforced; I do hereby call upon and direct all Peace Officers and other Liege Subjects of Her Majesty within this Province to be aiding and assisting in enforcing the same, and also in effecting the seizure of any Timber cut in violation of the aforesaid Proclamations by any persons whomsoever.

WHEREAS representations have been made to His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, that Licenced Teachers of Parish Schools, who have either relinquished the Schools in which they have been employed, or have been dismissed therefrom, and, under their present Licences, have frequently sought employment, as Teachers, in other parts of the Country, where they were unknown, and this, without any explanation of the causes of their removal;—His Excellency is pleased to prohibit this practice in future, and to direct, that Licenced Teachers, leaving a School in which they have been engaged, and seeking employment as Teachers elsewhere, shall procure from the Trustees of the School, in which they have been teaching, a certificate specifying the reasons of their leaving, and stating what their conduct had been during the period of their employment; which certificate and testimonial shall be exhibited to the Trustees with whom they propose to make a new engagement; and, in case of removal to another County, also to the Board of Education in that County, before whom they are required to be re-examined, as to their fitness for the office of Teacher; and the Licence of any person who shall be found to have infringed this Regulation, to which the particular attention of the several Boards of Education and Trustees of Schools is invoked, will be considered as cancelled.

## AT THE COURT AT WINDSOR.

The 6th of October, 1841.

## PRESENT:

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty, His Royal Highness Prince ALBERT, Lord President, Earl of Aberdeen, Lord Privy Seal, Earl Jernyn, Lord Steward, Lord Stanley, Lord Chamberlain, Sir James Graham, Bt. Earl of Jersey,

WHEREAS the Lieutenant Governor of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, with the Council and Assembly of the said Province, did in the month of March 1841, pass thirty Acts which have been transmitted, entitled as follows, viz:—

No. 1342. An Act relating to the summoning and attendance of Petit Jurors at the respective sittings and Circuit Courts in this Province.

No. 1343. An Act in addition to the Acts relating to Circuit Courts.

No. 1348. An Act to extend the provisions of an Act, intitled "An Act to enable Commissioners of Highways in the Parishes of Margerville, Sheffield and Waterborough, to lay out Highways, and to appropriate part of the Statute Labor for securing the Bank of the River in front of those Parishes," to the Parish of Gagetown, in Queen's County.

No. 1349. An Act to continue an Act, intitled "An Act to provide for the summary punishment of persons committing trespasses upon Square Timber and other Lumber."

No. 1350. An Act to authorize the Justices of the Peace in the County of Kent, to levy an Assessment to pay off the County Debt.

No. 1351. An Act to provide for more effectually repairing the Streets and Bridges in a part of the Parish of Saint Stephen's.

No. 1352. An Act to authorize the Justices of the Peace, for the County of Charlotte, to assess the Parish of Saint Stephen, in the said County, for the erection of a Wharf on the Public Landing at Salt Water, in said Parish.

No. 1353. An Act to authorize Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace for the County of Gloucester, to contract for the erection of a new Gaol in the said County, and for other purposes therein mentioned.

No. 1354. An Act to continue an Act, intitled "An Act for the better and more effectual securing the navigation of the Newcastle River, in Queen's County."

No. 1355. An Act to permit the establishment of a Fish Market in one of the Public Slips in the City of Saint John.

No. 1356. An Act to authorize the Justices of the Peace for the County of Carleton, to assess the said County to pay off the County Debts.

No. 1357. An Act to continue and amend an Act, intitled "An Act for the relief of old Soldiers of the Revolutionary War, and their Widows."

No. 1358. An Act to authorize the Justices of the Peace for the City and County of Saint John, to levy an Assessment to pay off the County Debt.

No. 1359. An Act to establish a Division Line between the Parishes of Northampton and Brighton, in the County of Carleton.

No. 1360. An Act for the better and more effectual securing the Navigation of the River Miramichi, in the County of Northumberland, and to protect the Fisheries on the said River.

No. 1362. An Act in addition to, and in amendment of an Act to provide for the erection of an Alms House and Work House, and to establish a Public Infirmary in and for the City and County of Saint John.

No. 1363. An Act to amend an Act, intitled "An Act for the appointment of Firewards, and the better extinguishing of fires which may

happen in the Parish of Portland, in the County of Saint John.

No. 1365. An Act to alter the times for holding the Terms of the Inferior Courts of Common Pleas and General Sessions of the Peace for the County of Sunbury.

No. 1366. An Act to authorize the Justices of the Peace for the County of Northumberland, to erect a Lock-up House in the Town of Chatham, in the said County.

No. 1367. An Act relating to the Office of Coroner in this Province.

No. 1368. An Act to authorize the appointment of Commissioners to lay out a Street or Highway through the Town of Chatham, and to establish and regulate Public Landings in the said Town.

No. 1369. An Act further to amend the Law relating to Bastardy.

No. 1371. An Act further to amend the Act to encourage the establishment of Banks of Savings in this Province.

No. 1374. An Act in addition to the Registry Acts of this Province.

No. 1376. An Act to appropriate a part of the Public Revenue to the payment of the ordinary services of the Province.

No. 1377. An Act to appropriate a part of the Public Revenue for the services therein mentioned.

No. 1378. An Act to provide for opening and repairing Roads and erecting Bridges throughout the Province.

No. 1379. An Act to provide for the protection of the Revenue.

No. 1383. An Act to prevent disorderly Riding or Driving on Public Bridges.

No. 1384. An Act further to alter and amend an Act, intitled "An Act to authorize the widening and enlarging of certain Streets in the City of Saint John, and of laying out other Streets therein."

And whereas the said Acts have been referred to the Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, appointed for the consideration of all matters relating to Trade and Foreign Plantations, and the said Committee have reported as their opinion to Her Majesty, that the said Acts should be left to their operation; Her Majesty was thereupon this day pleased, by and with the advice of her Privy Council, to approve the said report: Whereof the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief for the time being of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.
