The infant Prince, as eldest son of the Monarch, succeeds to the title of Duke of Cornwall, and at once enters upon the enjoyment of the ducal revenue for his sole use. In a tew days he will be created Prince of Wales : George the Fourth was so created when he was seven days old. The other titles usually conferred on the infant are, the Earldom of Chester in England, the Dukedom of Rothsay, Earldom of Carrick, and Barony of Renfrew, in Scotland. The Prince of Wales is a constituent part of the Order of the Garter; hence he becomes a Knight of the Garter as soon as he is created Prince of Wales.
