HEREAS a Proclamation, bearing date the twenty sixth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty seven, was issued by the Lieutenant Governor, forbidding all persons from occupying any part of the Wild Lands within this Province, comprehending the Territory in dispute between Great Britain and the United States of America, known under the denomination of the Disputed Territory, or trespassing thereon by cutting Timber or otherwise: And whereas by another Proclamation, bearing date the twenty second day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand Bersons whomsoever.
