Downing Street, April 21, 1842.

SIR,—I have received your Despatch No. 31, of the 30th ult., enclosing a Petition to the Queen, from the Magistrates, Merchants, and other Inhabitants of the County of York, praying that no change may be made in the scale of Duties on wood and other articles, which may affect the trade of New Brunswick with Great Britain and Ireland, and with the British West Indies.

I have to instruct you to acquaint the Petitioners, that I have had the honor to lay their Petition before the Queen, and that Her Majesty was pleased to receive it very graciously.

Your Despatch with the Petition has been referred by Her Majesty's command, for the consideration of the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade.
