During the last quarter it has been almost impossible (in town or country) to procure employment for Immigrants, owing to the general depression in the Province and the redundant influx, much distress therefore prevails among them.

4.-State any particulars relative to Immigration, the demand for Labour and the means of remunerating it, which you think may be useful.

Could any Public Works under the auspices of H. M. Government be under-taken, valid remuneration would be afforded to Emigrants, and objects of Local and National consideration effected.
