FERRY REGULATIONS.

QUEEN'S GENERAL SESSIONS.

June Sessions, 1842.

Ordered, That all former Rules and Regulations made for the government of the Ferries heretofore established at the mouth of the Jemseg Creek, in the Parish of Waterborough, from Ship Yard Point, so called, to the opposite shore of the said Creek, and also for the Ferry leading across the Washademoac Lake, from the landing of Mr. William Straight, on the Great Road of communication between Fredericton and the Finger Board, to the opposite shore of the Washademoak Lake, on said Road, and also the Ferry leading across the said Lake, at the Narrows, near Philip White's, be and the same are hereby revoked.

And further Ordered, That the aforesaid Ferries be and the same are hereby re-established: and that the Ferryman to be Licenced for the proper care and management of such Ferries, respectively, shall be subject to the Rules and Regulations hereafter made and ordained for the Government of the said Ferries respectively.

1st. That each Ferryman shall, before he undertake the management of any of such Ferry, procure a Licence from the Court for that purpose.

2nd. That every Ferryman so duly licenced as aforesaid, shall be provided with good and sufficient Boats and other Crafts, for the comfortable and safe conveyance of Passengers, Cattle, &c., under the penalty of five pounds for each and every offence, to be recovered as provided in and by the Act of Assembly in such case made and provided.

3rd. That any Ferryman so licenced, as aforesaid, who shall, without good and sufficient cause, wilfully detain any Passenger, or other, &c., from passing over such Ferries respectively, shall forfeit for each and every offence a sum not exceeding Three pounds, to be recovered in the manner provided in the aforegoing Rule.

4th. That no other person or persons, other than such Ferrymen, so to be licenced and appointed, shall, under any pretence whatever, transfer and carry over any person or persons, horses, cattle, or any other things, liable to Ferriages, by virtue of these Rules, save of his own Family or property, within one half mile of such Ferries respectively, under the penalty of Ten Shillings for each and every offence, to be recovered as aforesaid.

5th. Ordered, That the following Rates of Ferriage shall be charged, demanded, and taken by the Ferryman, to be appointed and Licenced as aforesaid, that is to say :--
