ill paid, they seldom hold them long. Hence most of the Schools are conducted by persons of inconsiderable attainments. The conduct of those under us is generally moral and their efforts zealous, no regular religious instruction, for fear of exciting prejudices. Several of the Teachers conduct Sunday Schools Instruction very limited, and great want of system, which offers serious impediment to advancement. Normal and Training Schools very desirable. Every person desirous of becoming a Teacher, should go through a certain period of Instructions and Probation, and attend Lectures on the nature of the mind, and so fitted by enlarged views and a systematic plan for the profession he is about to undertake.
