That the said John Crowley, on the third day of December, in the year aforesaid, in the City and County aforesaid, being employed to assist in launching a certain new ship, it so happened that when in the act of striking the ways of the said ship, a scaffolding attached to the upper part of the said ship, accidentally, casually, and by misfortune fell, by means whereof the said John Crowley had his skull fractured, of which said fracture the said John Crowley then and there instantly died—and so the jurors aforesaid upon their oath aforesaid do say that the said John Crowley accidentally, casually and by misfortune came to his death, and not otherwise.
