WHEREAS the Lieutenant Governor of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, with the Council and Assembly of the said Province, did, in the

month of March, 1841, pass five Acts, which have been transmitted, entitled as follows, viz:

No. 1344. An Act relating to the Parish Church of the Parish of Portland, in the County of Saint John, and to the Church Corporation of the said Parish.

No. 1347. An Act to continue an Act to provide for the prompt payment of all demands upon the Provincial Treasury.

No. 1361. An Act to extend the Provisions of an Act, intituled "An Act to encourage the establishment of Banks for Savings in this Province."

No. 1370. An Act to extend the Provisions of the Act for the increase of the Capital Stock of the Central Bank of New Brunswick.

No. 1380. An Act to grant a Loan of Six Thousand Pounds to John Walker of the City of Saint John.

And whereas the said Acts have been referred to the Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, appointed for the consideration of all matters relating to Trade and Foreign Plantations, and the said Committee have reported as their opinion to Her Majesty, that the said Acts should be left to their operation, Her Majesty was thereupon this day pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve the said Report; whereof the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Commander in Chief for the time being, of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.
