Form No. 3, being a report of the vacancies of all Postmasterships and Receiverships throughout Nova Scotia, to be dealt with

in the same manner as the proceeding form.

As the patronage of New Brunswick and of Prince Edward Island will be exercised by the Governor or Lieutenant Governor of those Provinces, you will transmit a copy of these Instructions and Forms of Return to the Post Master of Saint John, who is understood to have the chief arrangement of the Department in New Brunswick, under your authority, and also to the Post Master of Charlotte Town in Prince Edward Island, ordering them to send in these Returns direct to the Governor or Lieutepant Governor of those Provinces; and you will desire the Post Masters of these Provinces to report to the Post Masters of Saint John and of Charlotte Town, respectively, from time to time as they arise, any vacancies occurring in their own Colonies in order that no delay may take place, owing to the distance at which they are situated from Halifax.
