HEREAS the Lieutenant Governor of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick with the Council and Assembly of the said Province, did, in the month of March, 1841, pass one Act, which has been transmitted, entitled as follows, viz:—

No. 1345. An Act in further amendment of the Law; And whereas the said Act has been referred to the Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, appointed for the consideration of all matters relating to Trade and Foreign Plantations, and the said Committee have reported as their opinion to Her Majesty, that the said Act should be left to its operation; Her Majesty was thereupon this day pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve the said report: Whereof the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Commander in Chief for the time being of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by several Proclamations heretofore issued, bearing date the twenty ninth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and thirty seven, the twenty second day of October, one thousand eight hundred and thirty nine, and the twenty ninth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and forty one, the cutting of Timber in the Disputed Territory, pending the Settlement of the Boundary, was prohibited; and whereas it has been represented to me that notwithstanding such prohibitions, large quantities of Timber have been cut in and upon that Territory during the last year,—It is hereby publicly made known to all persons concerned, that if any part of the Timber so cut should be brought into the River Saint John, it will be liable to seizure; and all Seizing Officers, Magistrates and other persons on whom it may depend, are hereby required to be vigilant in aiding and assisting to prevent its introduction.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Fredericton, the ninth day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty two, and in the fifth year of Her Majesty's Reign.
