Earl of Jersey, THEREAS the Lieutenant Governor of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, with the Council and Assembly of the said Province, did, in the month of March, 1841, pass two Acts, which have been transmitted, entitled as follows, viz :-

No. 1372. An Act to incorporate the Westmorland Mining Company.

No. 1373. An Act to incorporate sundry persons by the name

of the Atlantic Assurance Company.

And whereas the said Acts have been referred to the Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, appointed for the consideration of all matters relating to Trade and Foreign Plantations; and the said Committee have reported as their opinion to Her Majesty that the said Acts should be left to their operation; Her Majesty was thereupon this day pleased, by and with the advice of her Privy Council, to approve the said report: Whereof the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Commander in Chief for the time being of her Majesty's Province of New Bruns. wick, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.
