VIII. And be it enacted, That whosoever shall by force, prevent or impede Impeding any perany person endeavouring to save his life from any ship or vessel which shall be to save his life from in distress or wrecked, stranded or cast on shore, (whether he shall be on board &c. any ship wrecked, or shall have quitted the same,) shall be guilty of felony, and being convicted thereof, shall be liable, at the discretion of the Court, to be imprisoned for the term of the natural life of such offender, or for any term not less than three years.

IX. And be it enacted, That whosoever shall unlawfully and maliciously destroy Destroying wrecks any part of any ship or vessel which shall be in distress or wrecked, stranded or longing thereto. cast on shore, or any goods, merchandize or article of any kind belonging to such ship or vessel, shall be guilty of felony, and being convicted thereof, shall be liable, at the discretion of the Court, to be imprisoned for any term not exceeding seven years.

X. And be it enacted, That every punishment by this Act imposed on any For the purpose of punishment malice person maliciously committing any offence, shall equally apply and be enforced, in offences to be inferred however conferred however confe whether the offence be committed from malice conceived against the owner of the ceived. property, in respect of which it shall be committed or otherwise.

XI. And be it enacted, That in the case of every felony punishable under this Punishment of ac-Act, every Principal in the second degree, and Accessory before the fact, shall be punishable with death or otherwise, in the same manner as the Principal in the first degree is by this Act punishable, and every Accessory after the fact, to any felony punishable under this Act, shall, on conviction, be liable to be imprisoned for any term not exceeding two years.

XII. And be it enacted, That when any person shall be convicted of any Punishment by imprisonment may be offence punishable under this Act, for which imprisonment may be awarded, it varied by adding shall be lawful for the Court to sentence the offender to be imprisoned, or to be soltary confineimprisoned and kept to hard labour in the Common Gaol or House of Correction, or the Provincial Penitentiary, and also to direct that the offender shall be kept in solitary confinement for any portion or portions of such imprisonment, or of such imprisonment with hard labour, not exceeding one month at any time, and not exceeding three months in any one year, as to the Court in its discretion shall seem meet.

XIII. And be it enacted, That this Act shall commence and take effect on Commencement of the first day of May one thousand eight hundred and forty two.

An Act to appropriate a part of the Public Revenue to the payment of the Ordinary Service of the Province.

Passed 4th April 1842.

I. E it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly, That there be allowed and paid out of the Treasury of the Province for the Services hereinafter mentioned, the following sums, to wit: To the Chaplain of the Legislative Council in General Assembly, the sum of Chaplains. twenty five pounds.

To the Chaplain of the House of Assembly, the sum of twenty five pounds.

To the Sergeant at Arms attending the Legislative Council in General Assembly, Sergeants at Arms the sum of twenty shillings per diem during the present Session.

To the Sergeant at Arms attending the House of Assembly, the sum of twenty

shillings per diem during the present Session.

To the Clerk of the Legislative Council in General Assembly, the sum of two Clerks of the Legislative Council and hundred pounds for his services during the present Session.

Clerks of the Legislative Council and Assembly. hundred pounds for his services during the present Session.

To the Clerk of the House of Assembly, the sum of two hundred pounds for his services during the present Session.

To the Clerk Assistant of the Legislative Council in General Assembly, the sum Clerks Assistants. of one hundred pounds for his services during the present Session.

To the Clerk Assistant of the House of Assembly, the sum of one hundred pounds for his services during the present Session.

To the Doorkeepers attending the Legislative Council and Assembly, the sum Door Keepers. of twelve shillings and six pence each, per diem during the present Session.

To the Messengers attending the Legislative Council and Assembly, the sum Messengers.

of ten shillings per diem each, during the present Session. To Beverly Robinson, Esquire, Province Treasurer, the sum of seven hundred Province Treasurer. and fifty pounds for his services for the year one thousand eight hundred and forty one, and the further sum of three hundred pounds to enable him to pay a Clerk.
