Regulations for the disposal of Crown Lands, by order of His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor in Council, 1st December, 1842:—

1st.—No land to be sold unless in locations previously surveyed under the directions of the Government.

2nd.—Purchasers of lots of fifty acres and under, not being indebted to the Crown for any land previously purchased, may be allowed to claim credit for the purchase money, upon giving Bonds to the Crown, payable with interest annually in advance, at the rate of six per cent. and paying the first year's interest at
