## KING'S COLLEGE, JUNE 12, 1843.

**A** CONVOCATION will be held on Thursday the 15th instant, for the purpose of considering the Regulations for the future Examination of Undergraduate Students, required by the Statute for extending the benefits of the University.

His Excellency the Chancellor has appointed the Vice-President to preach the Annual Sermon, on Sunday the 25th instant.

The Examination of the Collegiate School will take place on Wednesday the 21st, and that of the College on Tuesday the 27th.

The Encœnia will be celebrated on Thursday the 29th, when the Archdeacon will deliver the Commemorative Oration.

The Vice-President will be prepared to receive Candidates for Matriculation until Saturday, July the 1st; and all such as intend to keep Terms during the ensuing Academical year, (which commences on the first Thursday in September,) or to appear at the Annual Examination at the end of June next, agreeably to the above-mentioned Statute, are requested to present themselves accordingly.

## KING'S COLLEGE, FREDERICTON, March 8, 1843.

**T**WO Scholarships, founded by the College Council, become vacant at Midsummer; and will be offered to general competition in the College Library, on Monday, June the 26th, at ten in the forenoon.

The one is proposed to Candidates who shall have been already matriculated. They will be examined in Xenophon's Anabasis, Horace, English and Latin Composition, Ancient History and Geography, the first six books of Euclid, the first part of Algebra, and the Elements of Inorganic Chemistry.

The other is proposed to such as shall not have been matriculated; who will be examined in the first six books of Homer's Iliad, Cæsar's Commentaries, the principles of Greek and Latin Grammar, English History, Vulgar and Decimal Fractions, and the first four books of Euclid.

The Scholarships are of Twenty Five Pounds per annum each, to be held to the expiration of the third year from the day of matriculation. They will be awarded to the Candidates who shall discover the greatest proficiency in the several subjects of examination, without reference to their place of previous education, or the religious denomination to which they may belong.
