KING'S COLLEGE, JUNE 15, 1843.

AT a meeting of the Convocation assembled in conformity with an order of the College Council, for the purpose of making Regulations for the Examination of Undergraduate Students, agreeably to a Statute passed by the Council in the following words:

"Whereas it is required by the Statutes that no Term shall be reckoned towards a Degree without Academical Residence, and twelve Terms are required to be so kept before admission to the Degree of Bachelor of Arts;

"Be it enacted and declared, for the purpose of extending the benefits of the University, that Students who shall have been duly matriculated, and shall have satisfactorily passed an Examination at the College at the end of Trinity Term for three successive years, and also the appointed Examination for the Degree of Bachelor of Arts, presenting on these several occasions satisfactory testimonials of their moral character and good conduct, may without Academical Residence, or the performance of other Academical Exercises, be admitted to the said Degree:—"

It was resolved, that the following Regulations be henceforth observed:—

1. No person shall be matriculated without a thorough acquaintance with the Grammatical structure of the Greek and Latin Languages, the first Book of Euclid's Elements of Geometry, and Wood's Algebra to the end of Simple Equations; and at whatever time the Matriculation may take place, every Student shall commence his Academical Course at the beginning of Michaelmas Term.

2. At the first Annual Examination the Subjects shall be:—in Greek, the Gospel of St. Luke, with the Cyropædia of Xenophon, or the first six Books of Homer's Iliad; in Latin, Cicero *de Officiis*, the first five Books of Livy, or the first six Books of Virgil's *Æneid*; in Mathematics, the first four, sixth and eleventh Books of Euclid's Elements, the first part of Wood's Algebra, and the application of Trigonometry to the mensuration of heights and distances.

3. At the second Annual Examination the Subjects shall be:—in Greek, the Acts of the Apostles, with Herodotus, Aristotle's Rhetoric, or Sophocles; in Latin, Cicero *de Oratore*, the Georgics of Virgil, Horace, or Juvenal; in Mathematics, Spherical Trigonometry and Analytical Geometry; Chemistry and Geology.

4. At the third Annual Examination the Subjects shall be:—in Greek, the first Epistle of St. Peter, and the Epistles of St. Paul to the Thessalonians and to Timothy, with Aristotle's Ethics, Thucydides, or Pindar; in Latin, Cicero *de Finibus*, or Tacitus; in Mathematics, the Elements of the Differential and Integral Calculus, Theoretical Mechanics, and the Principles of Fluid Pressure; Zoology and Botany.

5. At the Final Examination for the Degree of Bachelor of Arts, the Subjects shall be taken from those above-mentioned, together with such others as may be proposed by the several Candidates; and all who shall pass this Examination, shall be classed and arranged according to their proficiency in the respective departments.
