LADIES' BENEVOLENT SOCIETY.

THE period of the year having arrived, when some assistance will again be required for the relief of the Poor during the rigour of an inclement season, the attention of the public is requested to the effect of the regulations adopted in the distributions last year; whereby a larger amount of relief was afforded to deserving objects than would have been effected in any other form, or than if it had been privately dispensed to the applicants. It is therefore hoped, that by the same effectual means, if again adopted, the sufferings of the poor in the approaching winter may be satisfactorily alleviated.

In the statement of the number of families relieved, it should be observed, that in some few instances the parties relieved had no families; but the greater proportion were heads of families, with not less than 3, and in many instances 7-8 children;—so that the actual number who were relieved, would probably amount to not less than 3-400. Many who received clothing were recipients of provisions also.

The Register kept daily at the place of issue, exhibits the name of the applicant relieved, the number of the applicant's family, the party recommending, and the amount of relief afforded, with such remarks as any particular case may call for; and is open for inspection.
