YORK GENERAL SESSIONS.

JANUARY TERM, 1843.

WHEREAS the method heretofore practised in keeping and making up the County Accounts is not sufficiently clear and explicit; therefore it is

Ordered, That hereafter the following Rules in keeping and making up the County Accounts be observed:—

That all persons, whether salaried officers or others, having claims upon the County, do file with the Accountant on or by the first Tuesday of each year, a Bill of Particulars of their several and respective claims, made up to and to include the last day of the then preceding year, 31st December.

That the Accountant do file with the Clerk on or by the first day of the opening of the Court in January, a schedule of all claims filed with him, agreeably to the foregoing Rule, setting forth the following particulars:—name of claimant, amount claimed, and nature of services rendered, shewing also the sum total of the whole, together with an estimate of the probable ordinary income, exclusive of assessments of the then current year.

That the Treasurer make up all his Accounts to the close of the year; that they in every case shew the actual state of the monetary affairs of the County, as they may happen to be at that time, namely, the close of the 31st day of December; that should there be any claims of the then current year remaining unpaid, either to or by the County, he do furnish along with his Accounts a particular statement thereof.

That the Treasurer keep a separate and distinct account of all the expenses of the County Gaol, including the keeper's salary; as also a separate account of the amount paid to the different Constables; the sum total of each of their account, to be entered in the General Account Current. All the County Accounts to be filed with the Clerk on or by the first day of the January Term, and to be referred to a Committee to audit, who shall carefully examine the same and report thereon on the first day of the June Term following.

That all the County Accounts be entered and kept in suitable Books, well bound, the Accounts to be kept regularly posted up, so as at all times to exhibit the true state of the monetary affairs of the County; all such Books to be laid on the Clerk's table during the sitting of the Court in January and June Terms, for the information and inspection of the Members of the Court and the Grand Jury.

That the Treasurer keep a separate account of all fines and forfeitures received by him, mentioning from whom received, by whom and for what offence levied, and name and residence of the offending party; all fines and forfeitures payable to the County, to be paid over to the County Treasurer, within one month after the same shall have been actually levied and paid by the offender.

All the County Accounts to exhibit the actual amount of receipts and expenditures of the County, within each year.
