J. W. Sheriff, Esq., the most substantial proof was given of its acceptableness to the House of Assembly by the bringing in and passing of a short Bill, which also received the cordial concurrence of the Board of Council, increasing the Legislative endowment from £400 currency, to £400 sterling per annum. Thirteen Members of the Lower House gave a further earnest of their good feeling towards the undertaking, by at once putting down their names for shares at £10 sterling each. The wish expressed by some that arrangements should be made for receiving Boarders, will undoubtedly be attended to by the Board of Guardians.

"The Archdeacon has been requested by the Board of Guardians to write without delay to the Bishop of Antigna, (whose presence in England is most opportune;) praying him to take the proper steps for forming a connection between the contemplated Institution here and King's College, London, and, (with the view of obtaining an eminently qualified Individual for so important an office) to confer with the Council of that College in making a selection of a Principal, to preside over "The Antigua Collegiate School," that, if possible, he may accompany his Lordship in his return to his Dioeese in the spring of next year: Also, that the Bishop would have the kindness to inform the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge and the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts of the progress made in this good work, and that, in the confident expectation of obtaining a grant of £500 sterling, from the Legislature and of raising the like amount by subscriptions towards the preparation or erection of a suitable Building for the intended "Collegiate School," his Lordship would entreat those Venerable Societies to extend their utmost aid towards so important an object.

"The Venerable Archdeacon Holberton, J. W. Sheriff, Oliver Nugent and Wm. Walker, Esquires, have been requested by the Board of Guardians to act as Corresponding Secretaries, and the services of the Hon. R. B. Eldridge, Manager of the West Ind'a Bank, have been thankfully accepted as Treasurer in behalf of the "Antigua Collegiate School."
