WHEREAS PATTY WILSON, of the Parish of Johnston, in Queen's County, was charged with being delivered of, and secreting the birth of a Male Child, on the night of the first day of October instant; and whereas the said Patty Wilson was charged by a Coroner's Inquisition upon the body of the said child with being
