## A PROCLAMATION.

**W**HEREAS the General Assembly of this Province stands prorogued to the last Tuesday in this instant month of September; I have thought fit further to prorogue the said General Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued to the third Tuesday in December next.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Fredericton, the twentieth day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty four, and in the eighth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

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**W**HEREAS the Lieutenant Governor of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, with the Council and Assembly of the said Province, did in the months of March and April 1844, pass five Acts, which have been transmitted, entitled as follows, viz:—

No. 1489. An Act to continue an Act relative to Desertion from Her Majesty's Forces, and to punish unlawful dealings with Soldiers and Deserters.

No. 1498. An Act to reduce the Duties imposed upon Ships or Vessels arriving at the Port of Saint John to provide for the support of sick and disabled Seamen not being paupers belonging to this Province.

No. 1499. An Act to authorize the erection of a Marine Hospital at Dalhousie, in the County of Restigouche, and to make further provision for sick and disabled Seamen not being paupers belonging to this Province, so far as the same may relate to the Port of Dalhousie.

No. 1511. An Act to establish the value of certain British Coins in this Province, and to amend the Acts relating to the establishment of a legal tender.

No. 1520. An Act to provide for a drawback upon Flour exported in certain cases.

And whereas the said Acts have been referred to the Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council appointed for the consideration of all matters relating to Trade and Foreign Plantations, and the said Committee have reported as their opinion to Her Majesty, that the said Acts should be left to their operation; Her Majesty was thereupon this day pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve the said Report: Whereof the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief for the time being, of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

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**W**HEREAS the Lieutenant Governor of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, with the Council and Assembly of the said Province, did in the month of April 1844, pass four Acts, which have been transmitted, entitled as follows, viz:—

No. 1478. An Act to regulate the management and disposal of the Indian Reserves in this Province.

No. 1480. An Act to enable Her Majesty's Government to carry into effect within the Province the provisions of the fourth Article of the Treaty of Washington.

No. 1481. An Act to incorporate the Arestook Boom Company.

No. 1482. An Act for the relief of the Reverend Samuel D. Rice.

And whereas the said Acts have been referred to the Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council appointed for the consideration of all matters relating to Trade and Foreign Plantations, and the said Committee have reported as their opinion to Her Majesty, that the said Acts should receive Her Majesty's special confirmation; Her Majesty was thereupon this day pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to declare Her special confirmation of the said Acts, and the same are hereby specially confirmed, ratified, and finally enacted accordingly: Whereof the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief for the time being, of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.
