#### REMARKS.

By the IX. Section of the foregoing Act, the Treasurer is required to retain and set apart, every year, until the Instalment and the Interest due on the Loan during that or any previous year are paid, the amount accruing from the "One per Cent." Duty imposed by this Act and also the amount paid into the Provincial Treasury by the Customs.

On an average of the Importations of manufactures liable to the "One per Cent." made from the Custom House returns of Imports for the last four years, this duty would amount to £7,500, Currency, per annum,—and the average amount paid into the Provincial Treasury by the Customs for the same period is £23,472 3 5 Currency, per annum,—making together £30,972 3 5 Currency,—which sum would procure Bills of Exchange on London, at the average rate of 8 per cent. premium, to an amount exceeding £25,000, Sterling.

The above Revenues are by this Act to be set apart to meet the Interest on £70,000, Sterling,

and which Interest will each year diminish as Instalments are paid off.

The new Imperial Tariff for the Colonies has been in operation only since the 6th of July last, but during that short period, although the scale of duties is materially diminished, the amount collected has rather increased in consequence of some articles formerly prohibited being now admitted at a duty, and others being imported in much greater quantities.
