To His Excellency Sir CHARLES THEOPHILUS METCALFE, Baronet, Kinght Grand Cross of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, one of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, Governor in Chief and Captain General in and over the Provinces of British North America, and Vice Admiral of the same.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY,-

We, the Magistrates and other Inhabitants of the County of Carleton, in the Province of New Brunswick, presuming upon the privilege, which our position as Colonial British subjects vouchsafes to us, and inspired by the deepest feelings of reverence for that beautiful form of mixed Monarchical Government, under which we have the happiness to live, claim the right in common with the
