**W**HEREAS the General Assembly of this Province stands  
prorogued to Tuesday the twenty fifth day of June instant;  
I have thought fit further to prorogue the said General Assembly,  
and the same is hereby prorogued to the last Tuesday in September  
next.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Fredericton, the twenty  
fourth day of June, in the year of our Lord one thou-  
sand eight hundred and forty four, and in the eighth  
year of Her Majesty's Reign.

**W**HEREAS the Lieutenant Governor of Her Majesty's  
Province of New Brunswick, with the Council and As-  
sembly of the said Province, did, in the months of March and  
April, 1844, pass twenty five Acts, which have been transmitted,  
entitled as follows, viz:—

No. 1484. "An Act to authorize the Justices of the Peace in  
the County of Kent, to levy an assessment to defray the contingent  
expenses of the County."

No. 1485. "An Act to authorize the Justices of the Peace for  
the County of Charlotte, to make further provision for the payment  
of the Treasurer of that County."

No. 1486. "An Act to authorize the Justices of the Peace for  
the County of Charlotte, to levy an assessment to pay of the  
County debt."

No. 1487. "An Act for altering the times of holding one of the  
Terms of the General Sessions of the Peace and Inferior Courts of  
Common Pleas of the County of Carleton."

No. 1490. "An Act to authorize the Justices of the Peace in  
and for the City and County of Saint John, to make compensation  
to the Assessors of Taxes for the City and Parish of Saint John,  
and Parishes of Simonds, Lancaster and Saint Martin's, for the  
year 1843; also to the Assessors of Taxes for the Parish of Port-  
land for the year 1842."

No. 1492. "An Act to levy a Tax on Dogs in the Towns of  
Dalhousie and Campbellton, in the County of Restigouche."

No. 1493. "An Act to amend an Act entitled "An Act to  
regulate the Fencing, Occupation and Grazing of the several  
Marshes, Low Lands and Meadows in the County of Westmorland."

No. 1494. "An Act to authorize the Justices of the Peace in  
the County of Carleton to levy an assessment to pay off the County  
debts."

No. 1495. "An Act to remove the old Gaol of the City and  
County of Saint John."

No. 140.

No. 1501. "An Act to amend an Act, entitled "An Act to  
repeal an Act to encourage the destroying of Wolves, and an Act  
to grant a bounty on the destruction of Bears in the Province, and  
to make other provisions in lieu thereof."

No. 1502. "An Act to authorize the use of a part of the build-  
ing erected for a Market House, on the western side of the Har-  
bour in the City of Saint John, for other purposes than a Market."

No. 1503. "An Act to authorize the Trustees of Saint John  
Church in Richmond, to sell lands, and to apply the proceeds thereof  
for certain purposes."

No. 1504. "An Act in addition to an Act, entitled an Act to  
prevent Nuisances within the City of Saint John."

No. 1505. "An Act in addition to an Act, entitled an Act to  
provide for the erection of an Alms House and Work House, and  
to establish a Public Infirmary in and for the City and County of  
Saint John."

No. 1506. "An Act to alter the Division Line between the  
Parishes of Kingston and Norton in King's County."

No. 1512. "An Act further to continue an Act to provide for  
the prompt payment of all demands upon the Province Treasury."

No. 1513. "An Act further to amend the Laws relating to  
Bankruptcy in this Province."

No. 1514. "An Act to afford relief to persons unfortunate in  
business in certain cases."

No. 1519. "An Act for more effectually securing the Naviga-  
tion of the River and Harbour of Saint John, in the City and  
County of Saint John."

No. 1522. "An Act to enable the Justices of the Peace of the  
City and County of Saint John to pay off a portion of the debts  
now due by the County of Saint John."

No. 1523. "An Act further to amend the Law relating to Wills,  
Legacies, Executors and Administrators, and for the settlement  
and distribution of the Estates of Intestates."

No. 1524. "An Act to repeal an Act, entitled an Act to pro-  
vide for the greater safety of Passengers on board of Steam Boats,  
and to make further provision in lieu thereof."

No. 1526. "An Act to appropriate a part of the Public Revenue  
for the payment of the Ordinary Services of the Province."

No. 1527. "An Act to appropriate a part of the Public Revenue  
for the Services therein mentioned."

No. 1528. "An Act to provide for opening and repairing Roads  
and erecting Bridges throughout the Province."

And whereas the said Acts have been referred to the Committee  
of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council,  
appointed for the consideration of all matters relating to Trade and  
Foreign Plantations, and the said Committee have reported as their  
opinion to Her Majesty, that the said Acts should be left to their  
operation, Her Majesty was thereupon this day pleased, by and  
with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve the said Report:  
whereof the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in  
Chief for the time being of Her Majesty's Province of New Bruns-  
wick, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take  
notice, and govern themselves accordingly.
