BISHOPRIC OF NEW BRUNSWICK.

We, the undersigned Archbishops and Bishops, forming the Committee appointed to act, in concert with her Majesty's Government, for the erection and endowment of additional Bishoprics in the Colonies and Dependencies of Great Britain, invite the attention of all the Members of the Church of England to the following brief Statement:

In a Report, dated the 23d day of June, 1843, we announced our intention of recommending to Her Majesty's Government the erection of a separate Bishopric for the Province of New Brunswick, as soon as an adequate endowment had been provided; and we estimated that sufficient endowment at a sum of £30,000, invested on good security. Of this amount nearly £27,000 has been contributed at home or in the Province. The comparatively small sum, therefore, of £3,000 is all that remains to be provided for this important object; and we are persuaded, that when it is generally known how little is wanting for the attainment of the end in view, the necessary funds will be readily contributed.

We need not here repeat the expression of our conviction, that the great extent and rapidly increasing population of New Brunswick, combined with other circumstances peculiarly affecting its religious interests at the present moment, render the immediate appointment of a Bishop a matter of vital importance to the present and prospective welfare of the Church in that Colony; and most earnestly therefore do we commend the object to all who desire to see the Church of this country taking her allotted part in the extension of the Redeemer's Kingdom.
