At a Court of Special Sessions of the Peace holden in and for the County of York, at the County Court House in Fredericton, Saturday the 22d day of November, 1845:

THE Court having under consideration a Communication from the Honorable the Provincial Secretary, stating that His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor was apprehensive that, from the partial failure of the Potato Crop, a scarcity of provisions may be felt in some parts of the Province, and requesting the Magistrates to afford such information to His Excellency on the subject as may enable the Government to adopt all means in their power towards mitigating any injurious consequences likely to ensue: It is ordered, that the matter stand for further consideration at the Court of General Sessions in January next, and that the Magistrates in the different parts of this County be requested then to attend prepared to furnish the information desired.
