A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it appears from an Inquest held before Robert Payne and John Gallagher, Esquires, two of Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace for the City and County of Saint John, on view of the body of John Allingham, deceased, that the said John Allingham came to his death by a blow on the right side of his head inflicted by some person unknown; I do therefore publish this Proclamation, and do hereby offer a Reward of Fifty Pounds to whomsoever shall give such information to Her Majesty's Attorney General of the person or persons by whom the offence was committed, as will enable him to prosecute the offender or offenders to conviction.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Fredericton, the twenty third day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty five, and in the eighth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

WHEREAS the Lieutenant Governor of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, with the Council and Assembly of the said Province, did in the month of April 1844, pass an Act which has been transmitted, entitled as follows, viz:—

No. 1500. An Act relating to the Collection of Duty on Timber and other Lumber.

And whereas the said Act has been referred to the Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council appointed for the consideration of all matters relating to Trade and Foreign Plantations, and the said Committee have reported as their opinion to Her Majesty, that the said Act should be left to its operation: Her Majesty was thereupon this day pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve the said Report; whereof the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief for the time being, of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.
