##### FRESH BEEF.

Such quantities of Ox or Heifer Beef of the best marketable quality, as may be required for Her Majesty's Land Forces at Fredericton and Woodstock, during the 12 months commencing the 1st January, 1846. The deliveries to the Troops to be made from the Contractor's shop or stall, and to consist of *Hind* and *Fore Quarters*, and no other, subject to the inspection and approval of the Commissariat; and to be conveyed to the Barracks at the expense of the Contractor. The issues to the Staff and Departments to be made in suitable pieces from the shop or stall as aforesaid.

##### BAKING BREAD,

For one year from the 1st of January, 1846, for the Troops and Departments at Fredericton, in such quantities as may be required, and to be delivered from the Bake house or shop of the Contractor, but conveyed for the Troops to the Barracks at his expense. The Bread to be baked at least twelve hours previous to delivery. The Tenders to state the number of pounds of well baked Bread that will be delivered for one hundred pounds of Flour provided by the Commissariat. The Flour to be taken from the Commissariat Stores at the Contractor's expense, for which he will be allowed the empty barrels.

##### FORAGE,
