**W**HEREAS the Lieutenant Governor of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, with the Council and Assembly of the said Province, did in the months of March and April, 1844, pass three Acts, which have been transmitted, entitled as follows, viz:—

No. 1491. An Act to amend an Act, entitled "An Act to regulate Vessels arriving from the United Kingdom with Passengers and Emigrants:—"

No. 1517. An Act to restrain the provisions of the 5th section of an Act, entitled "An Act for the support of the Civil Government in this Province, and to establish sundry regulations for the future sale and disposal of Timber in certain cases:—"

No. 1518. An Act to facilitate the collection and recovery of small Debts due to the Crown, arising from the sale of Crown Lands and Timber.

And whereas the said Acts have been referred to the Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, appointed for the consideration of all matters relating to Trade and Foreign Plantations, and the said Committee have reported as their opinion to Her Majesty, that the said Acts should be left to their operation; Her Majesty was thereupon this day pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve the said Report: Whereof the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief for the time being, of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.
