## A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the General Assembly of this Province stands  
prorogued to Tuesday the twenty third of September  
instant, I have thought fit further to prorogue the said General  
Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued to the fourth Tuesday  
in December next.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Fredericton, the tenth  
day of September, in the year of our Lord one thou-  
sand eight hundred and forty five, and in the ninth  
year of Her Majesty's Reign.

WHEREAS the Lieutenant Governor of Her Majesty's Pro-  
vince of New Brunswick, with the Council and Assembly  
of the said Province, did, in the month of March, 1845, pass eighty  
eight Acts, which have been transmitted, entitled as follows, viz:

No. 1542. An Act to provide for the expenses incurred by the  
Commissioners of the Provincial Penitentiary.

No. 1543. An Act to continue the Act to provide for the pay-  
ment of Interest on Warrants.

No. 1544. An Act to continue an Act, intituled "An Act to  
prevent Pedlars travelling and selling within this Province without  
Licence."

No. 1545. An Act to continue the Act for prohibiting and sup-  
pressing of Lotteries in this Province.

No. 1546. An Act to continue an Act, intituled "An Act for  
the better and more effectual securing the Navigation of the New-  
castle River, in Queen's County."

No. 1547. An Act further to continue an Act, intituled "An  
Act to authorize the Justices of the Peace in the County of York  
to make further provision for the payment of the Treasurer of that  
County."

No. 1548. An Act to continue the Act imposing a Duty on Rum  
and other Liquors distilled within the Province.

No. 1549. An Act to continue an Act to provide for the services  
of the Clerk of the Circuit Courts in this Province.

No. 1550. An Act to continue an Act, intituled "An Act to  
authorize the Justices of the Peace in certain Counties in the Pro-  
vince to exempt the French Inhabitants from the assessment of  
Poor Rates."

No. 1551. An Act to continue an Act to regulate Dockage,  
Wharfage and Cranage in the City of Saint John, and in the Pa-  
rish of Portland.

No. 1552. An Act to continue an Act to revive and continue an  
Act to regulate the driving of Timber and Saw Logs down the  
River Magaguadavic and its Branches.

No. 1553. An Act to continue an Act to extend the provisions  
of an Act, intituled "An Act to repeal the Laws now in force for  
appointing Firewards and the better extinguishing of Fires, so far  
as the same relate to the Town of Fredericton, and to make regu-  
lations more suitable to the said Town," to the Towns of Newcastle  
and Chatham and their vicinities, in the County of Northumberland.

No. 1554. An Act to continue certain Acts relating to the  
Fisheries in the County of Northumberland, that are now expiring.

No. 1555. An Act to continue an Act for the regulation  
of Booms for securing Masts, Logs and Lumber in certain parts  
of the County of Northumberland.

No. 1556. An Act to continue an Act to lay a Tax on Dogs  
in a certain part of the Parish of Chatham, in the County of Nor-  
thumberland.

No. 1557. An Act to continue the Act for the better and more  
effectual securing the navigation of the River Miramichi, in the  
County of Northumberland, and to protect the Fisheries on the  
said River.

No. 1558. An Act to continue an Act to regulate the Assize of  
Bread in the Towns of Newcastle and Chatham, in the County of  
Northumberland.

No. 1559. An Act to continue an Act, intituled "An Act to  
repeal an Act, intituled 'An Act for the security of the navigation  
of certain Harbours in the County of Northumberland, and to make  
more effectual provision for the better security of the Harbours in  
the Counties of Northumberland, Kent and Gloucester.'"

No. 1560. An Act to continue an Act, intituled "An Act for  
the appointment of Firewards in the Parish of Woodstock."

No. 1561. An Act to continue an Act for supplying the Town  
of Saint Andrews with water by Pipes.

No. 1562. An Act to continue an Act, intituled "An Act for  
the better and more effectual securing the navigation of the River  
Saint Croix, in the County of Charlotte, and also further to con-  
tinue an Act, intituled 'An Act to empower the Justices of the  
County of Charlotte to make regulations for driving Timber and  
Logs down the Rivers Saint Croix, Magaguadavic, Digdeguash,  
and their Branches.'"

No. 1563. An Act to continue the several Acts now in force re-  
lating to Tavern Keepers and Retailers.

No. 1564. An Act to continue the Act to provide for the col-  
lection of County and Parish Rates.

No. 1565. An Act to continue the several Acts now in force for  
the regulation of Cartmen, Waggoners and Truckmen, and for  
regulating the truckage of Goods and the measurement of Coals  
and Salt.

No. 1566. An Act to continue an Act, intituled "An Act to  
continue the Act relating to Church Wardens and Vestrymen,  
and to persons having voices in their election, so far as relates to  
the Parish Church of Saint Andrews."

No. 1567. An Act to continue several Acts relating to the ap-  
pointment of Firewards and the better extinguishment of Fires in  
a part of the Parish of Saint Stephen, in the County of Charlotte.

No. 1568. An Act to continue an Act to provide for the erec-  
tion of Fences, with Gates, across Highways leading through in-  
tervale lands in Queen's County and the County of Sunbury,  
where the same may be found necessary, and to extend the pro-  
visions of the same to King's County.
