The Saw Mills are capable of containing as many Gangs as there are now single Saws, which could be substituted at little cost; they are in perfect order, and some of the Gangs could be driven throughout the entire year, as there are always several of the Saws kept going during the entire Winter; and the Grist Mill has the same advantage. The Dam is in perfect and complete order, having been completed at very great expense, and runs entirely across the River given to the Purchaser. There can scarcely be found within this Nashwaak, thus securing the whole waters of the River for the Province such a valuable Water privilege, and it is therefore well driving of the Mills.
