CAP. I.

An Act relating to certain Lands belonging to Her Majesty, and for vesting the Title to the same in the Principal Officers of Her Majesty's Ordnance Department.

Passed 11th February 1845.

THEREAS divers Messuages, Lands, Tenements, Estates and other Preamble. 'Hereditaments in this Province have, at various times, been set apart 'from the Crown Reserves and Estates, and placed under the charge of the 'Officers of the Department of Her Majesty's Ordnance, or of the Governor or 'Lieutenant Governor respectively for the time being, for Military Defence: And 'whereas divers other Messuages, Lands, Tenements, Estates and other Here-'ditaments in this Province have, at various times, been purchased for the use of the Department of Her Majesty's Ordnance, or for Military Defence, and 'have been conveyed to, or to several different persons in trust for, Her Majesty 'and Her Royal Predecessors, and Her and Their Heirs and Successors, and 'the same have been placed under the charge of the said Department, or of the 'Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Commander of Her Majesty's Forces in 'this Province: And whereas it may be expedient that such parts of the 'said Messuages, Lands, Tenements, Estates and other Hereditaments as may 'not be wanted for the service of the said Department, or for Military Defence, 'should from time to time be sold and disposed of: And whereas for effecting 'such Sales it is necessary that all and every the said Messuages, Lands, 'Tenements, Estates and other Hereditaments so already set apart, or placed 'under charge, or purchased, or used and occupied, by or for the service of the 'said Ordnance Department, and all other Messuages, Lands, Tenements, Estates 'and other Hereditaments that may be hereafter purchased or set apart, or in 'any manner used and occupied by or for the service of the said Department, 'should be vested in the Principal Officers of Her Majesty's Ordnance for the 'time being;'
