



A PROCLAMATION.

HEREAS the General Assembly of this Province stands prorogued to the last Tuesday of this present month of June, I have thought fit further to prorogue the said General Assembly, and the same is hereby further prorogued to Tuesday the twenty second day of September next.

GOVERNMENT NOTICE.

REGULATIONS for the disposal of Timber and Lumber, under the 5th Section of the Act, 8th Wm. 4, cap. 1:--

lst. After the 15th day of August next, all applications for License of Grounds remaining unsold from the July sales, shall be made by Petition, which shall describe the situation of the ground, and specify the number of Square Miles required by the applicant. No Petition to be for more than ten, nor less than two Square Miles.

2d. One application only to be received at the Surveyor General's Office for the same ground.

3d. Every applicant on filing his Petition, shall deposit with the Receiver General the sum of ten shillings upon each Square Mile applied for, and should the party so depositing become the purchaser at Auction, such deposit shall be applied toward the payment of the purchase money. And in case the ground so applied for, shall not be purchased at the time advertised for the sale thereof, the deposit so made shall be forfeited; and in case some other person than the depositor, shall become the purchaser, and comply with the terms of sale, the amount so deposited shall be forthwith refunded to the party who may have paid the same.

A description Ticket, as heretofore will be given to the purchaser.

4th. All Berths applied for shall, if vacant, be advertised in the Royal Gazette, semi-monthly, and at least fourteen days notice of sale given; and unless the whole of the purchase money be paid by the purchaser to the Receiver General, at the time of the sale, such sale shall be void, and the ground may forthwith be put up again for competition between any other parties, the upset price being in all cases ten shillings per Square Mile.

5th. All Timber, Logs or other Lumber cut upon unlicensed Crown Lands, or which may be cut by any person beyond the limits of his own Berth, shall be seized and forfeited to the use of the Crown, and no Timber or Lumber shall be cut on any Berth applied for, until the Mileage be paid, and the description Ticket issued. GOVERNMENT NOTICE.

NOTICE is hereby given, That before any Reserve be made for any Mill under the Act recently passed, intituled "An Act to authorize the granting of Mill Reserves in certain cases," the applicant, at his own expense, shall cause a survey and inspection of such Mill, by some Deputy Surveyor and Seizing Officer, and procure his Report, stating how long such Mill has been in operation, its position, capability, and state of repair, and any other information which may be necessary to enable His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, in Council, to decide upon the propriety of making the Reserve, and to what extent.
