A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it appears from an Inquest held before William Bayard, Esquire, Coroner of our Lady the Queen for the City of Saint John, on the tenth day of February instant, on view of the body of a new born Male Child, then and there lying dead, that some person or persons unknown did make an assault on the said child, being alive, and by exposure to the cold and snow in a certain passage way in the said City, and then and there deserting and abandoning the said child, so being alive, did then and there feloniously, wilfully, and of malice aforethought, cause the death of the said child:

I do therefore publish this Proclamation, and do hereby offer a Reward of Fifty Pounds to whomsoever shall give such information of the Person or Persons by whom such offence was committed, as may lead to the apprehension and conviction of the offender.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Fredericton, the twenty fourth day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty six, and in the ninth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

WHEREAS the Lieutenant Governor of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, with the Council and Assembly of the said Province, did, in the months of March and April, 1844, pass two Acts, which have been transmitted, entitled as follows, viz:—

No. 1497. An Act to empower the Justices of the Peace for the County of Gloucester, in their General Sessions, to regulate the Fisheries in the said County.

No. 1516. An Act to incorporate the Fredericton Boom Company.

And whereas the said Acts have been referred to the Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, appointed for the consideration of all matters relating to Trade and Foreign Plantations; and the said Committee have reported, as their opinion, to Her Majesty, that the said Acts should be left to

their operation; Her Majesty was thereupon this day pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve the said report: Whereof the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief for the time being of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.
