BY HIS HONOR THE MASTER OF THE ROLLS.

*In the matter of Malcom Wilmot, Junior, of Monkton, in the County
 of Westmorland, Cordwainer.*

WHEREAS an Order bearing date the thirteenth day of
 April last past, pursuant to the Act of Assembly, entitled
 "An Act to afford relief to persons unfortunate in business in
 certain cases," made upon the Petition of the said Malcom
 Wilmot, Junior, setting forth a statement of his affairs as therein
 particularly detailed, it was ordered, that the Clerk of the Peace of
 the County of Westmorland should call a Public Meeting of the
 Creditors of the said Petitioner to be holden on the twentieth day
 of May then next, for the purpose of enabling the said Petitioner
 to make terms with his Creditors and to render an exposition of his
 affairs: And whereas it appeared by the Affidavit of the said Peti-
 tioner, that in consequence of an error in the publishing of the said
 Notice, no Meeting of the Creditors took place: And whereas by
 an Order made on the fourth day of June last past, in alteration and
 amendment of the said recited Order, it was ordered, that the Clerk of
 the Peace aforesaid, should call a Public Meeting of the Creditors
