On Saturday the 25th April, aged 53 years, JAMES HOLBROOK, Esquire, Master of the English Department in the Collegiate School of Fredericton. This upright and estimable man, having emigrated from England in the prime of life, received, twenty four years since, under the auspices of Major General Smyth, then Lieutenant Governor, his appointment in the College of New Brunswick. Mr. Holbrook subsequently married the youngest daughter of the late Lieutenant Colonel Hailes, at one time administering the Government of the Province. The deep affliction of his widow and three orphan daughters, will, it may be trusted, derive consolation (next to the assured hopes of religion, on whose services he was a constant and devout attendant) from the grateful and affectionate respect with which his memory is cherished by the numerous body in whose education Mr. Holbrook sustained an important part.
