of those on board, observations on the vessels, the quality of food and water, and the general condition of the

"These Ship Returns are made up in duplicate, one copy remaining in the Office, and the other being transmitted to His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, with a special Report in such cases as require observation or need prosecution. At the end of the Quarter, a General Return is made up (in triplicate) of all the Emigrants who have arrived during the Quarter, with the prices of provisions, rates of wages, and answers to the printed queries. The Deputy Treasurers send to the Agent, their Returns from the several Out Ports, and these are embodied in his General Return, which thus embraces the whole Province.

"At the close of the year an Annual Return is compiled from the Quarterly Returns, with Statements of the rates of Wages, prices of Provisions, prices of Agricultural Produce and of Farming implements. These with a Report for the past year, and a Statement of the prospect of employment for the coming season, are made in Quadruplicate, two copies of each Document being transmitted to His Excellency, and one copy to the Colonial Land and Emigration Commissioners, by their special order, all the Official Letters, Returns and Documents of every description, which have accumulated during the year, are then regularly arranged in volumes and bound,

"The correspondence with the Public Departments in this Province, the Deputy Treasurers, the Emigration Agents at the various Ports in England and Ireland, the Emigration Commissioners, Public Functionaries in the Colonies and the United States, and with many persons who address Letters to this Office for information, occupies much time and requires very considerable labor. In addition to this, there are the tasks of listening to the complaints of Emigrants, investigating their wrongs, redressing their grievances, instituting and carrying on prosecutions, obtaining relief, shelter and assistance for the sick, the destitute and the maimed, all requiring great exertion, indoors and outdoors, and no small stock of patience. The Agent abstains from a description of the places and scenes he has to visit, and of the state of some of the Vessels and Emigrants on their arrival, as being far from agreeable.

"The Contingent Expenses of the Office last year, amounted to £48 2 2, and to £33 17 11 for the previous

year, thus leaving him £82 0 1 in advance, for the Public Service.

"The Agent suggests the inadequacy of the Salary to the duties performed, and invites attention to the hardship of an Officer at the head of a Department, being obliged to maintain a Public Office, and pay all its Contingent expenses, out of the smallest Salary in the Province."
